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About Safe Routes Partnership

The Safe Routes Partnership, originally the Safe Routes to School National Partnership, began as a program of PeopleForBikes with leadership spearheading the early demonstration projects, advocacy, and eventual federal support for the Safe Routes to School program in the United States. After much success over the years in supporting the Safe Routes to School movement at the federal, state, and local levels as well as work in advancing social equity and active transportation, the organization became an independent 501(c)(3) organization in 2013 and solidified its commitment to being the leading national nonprofit organization for Safe Routes to School.

Safe Routes Partnership is deeply committed to expanding federal resources for Safe Routes to School as well as walking and rolling in everyday life with a core focus on advancing equity. Since its founding, the Safe Routes Partnership has placed a high value on partnerships and continues to engage more than 800 partners interested in supporting their mission and working together to create healthier, thriving communities for people of all ages, races, income levels, and abilities. Safe Routes Partnership is also in the sixth year of an initiative to expand safe routes to local parks and to increase state-based funding for safe routes to parks.

Safe Routes Partnership aims to advance policy change, catalyze support for healthy communities, foster a commitment to equity in active transportation, and share our deep expertise to improve support for walking and bicycling to school and beyond.

Today, more than 17,000 schools are benefiting from the many positive outcomes of federal Safe Routes to School programs. An estimated 6.8 million children now enjoy safer sidewalks and pathways for walking and bicycling to school, bicycle and pedestrian safety education, and encouragement programs.

The Safe Routes Partnership provides crucial support to these efforts: promoting walking and bicycling, advancing safety and physical activity through policy change, and encouraging healthy community design that enhances livability and quality of life in all communities.
