Role of State Leaders

<u>Governor</u>

- Many state priorities
- Variety of appeals
- Understand opposing views
- Limits to control
- What issues do they champion?



Role of State Leaders

Agency Leaders

- More focused priorities
- Many programs with budget to balance

Staff and Committees

- Staff are key conduit to Leader
- Advisory or special committees on specific issues

- What is your state's record?
- Who makes decisions?
- Subscribe to web updates
- Attend committee meetings, review agendas and minutes



Review

- State leadership statutes, guiding principles
- Governor's stated priorities and record of decisions
- State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP)
- Strategic Highway Safety Plan (SHSP)
- State Health Improvement Plan (SHIP)
- Safe Routes to School project lists
- State board, committee, and coalition planning documents and reports

California example:

Identifying SRTS projects and high crash risk areas in a state leader's home city or district can strengthen their interest. I brought a map of crash risk around schools to a meeting with the DOT Director that drew him in to the issues in his home city.



Connect

- Get to know key staff
- Educate on key talking points
- Keep them updated
- Establish partnerships with organizations around shared goals



Participate

- Educate state leaders
- Participate in public meetings
- Meet with staff
- Invite the state leader to events
- Be persistent!



Talking Points



Safety

Since 2001, injuries and fatalities to children walking and biking in California have steadily declined as mode share has increased.

• Health

Between 2001 and 2009, the rate of children walking to school in California increased 10 percent.

• Environment

10-14 percent of traffic on the road during the morning commute represents parents driving children to school.
